The Mid-America Addiction Technology Transfer Center (Mid-America ATTC) is excited to launch the another cohort of the intensive 3-part training series combining a 30-hour Clinical Supervision Foundations training with an 6-session Project ECHO! This cohort will be all virtual due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Enrollment will be limited to a total of 40 participants.

Eligibility – *I am eligible to apply if . . .*

- ✓ I currently provide clinical supervision and am recognized as someone qualified to provide clinical supervision in my state
- ✓ I work in a substance use disorder treatment service in Iowa, Kansas, Missouri, or Nebraska



Detailed Explanation of the Intensive 3-Part Training Series

Clinical Supervision Foundations: 30-Hour Training

2-part, 30-hour course* is designed for supervisors working in substance use disorder treatment and recovery settings. The course introduces clinical supervisors and persons preparing to become supervisors to the knowledge and skills essential to the practice of supervision and meets the minimum education requirements of clinical supervision credentialing organizations (i.e., IC&RC; NAADAC).

Part I: Clinical Supervision Foundations – A Self-Paced, 14-hour Online Course

introduces the terms, topics, and resources essential to clinical supervision.

- This 10-module (14 hour) introductory online course is intended as a first step in preparing clinicians to provide meaningful clinical supervision.
- Successful completion of **Part I: Clinical Supervision Foundations** (score of 70% or better on quizzes) is a prerequisite for enrollment into the **Part II of the series**. Participants should plan to complete the Part 1 online course **five business days** prior to the in-person training.

Part II: Clinical Supervision –14.5-hour Virtual Training designed to prepare the clinical supervisor to observe job performance, provide feedback and coaching, prioritize learning needs, develop achievable learning objectives and continue monitoring performance to assess counselor effectiveness.



Part III: Clinical Supervision Project ECHO begins September 8, 2021.

The purpose of the *ATTC PROJECT ECHO: Enhancing Workforce Capacity to Provide Clinical Supervision for Substance Use Disorders (CS-4-SUD)* is to democratize clinical supervision knowledge and disseminate best practices to counselors and other frontline substance use disorder treatment staff who are in a variety of settings. Using videoconferencing, best practice protocols, and case-based learning, a clinical supervision specialist team (“Hub”) and SUD clinicians/clinical supervisors (“Spokes”) participate in bi-weekly clinics. The CS-4-SUD ECHO creates an ongoing, 5-month learning community where participants (“Spokes”) receive support and develop the skills needed to master complexities in clinical supervision. Case-based learning is critical to the Project ECHO approach to democratizing knowledge, therefore each “Spoke” is expected to sign up to present at least one case during the course of the five-month learning community.

More About Project ECHO® (Extension for Community Health Outcomes)

The mission of Project ECHO is to democratize medical knowledge and get best practice care to underserved people worldwide. The heart of the ECHO model™ is its hub-and-spoke knowledge-sharing networks, led by expert teams who use multi-point videoconferencing to conduct virtual sessions.
