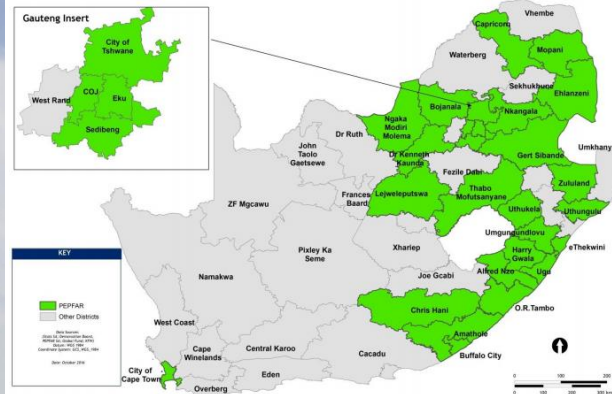

The South Africa – HIV Addiction Technology Transfer Centre

is part of a network comprised of 10 Domestic Regional Centres, 6 International HIV Centres (funded by PEPFAR) and a Network Coordinating Office. Together the Network serves the 50 U.S. states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and several Pacific Islands. International HIV ATTCs serve South Africa, Vietnam, Southeast Asia, and Ukraine.

The goals of the ATTC network are to:

- Accelerate the adoption and implementation of appropriate evidence-based treatment for HIV, substance use disorders, and mental illness
- Heighten the knowledge and skills of lay and professional individuals involved in the delivery of care for HIV, substance use disorders, and mental illness
- Foster provincial and national partnerships amongst culturally diverse practitioners, researchers, policy-makers, funders and experts.

- Provides technical assistance in the adoption and implementation of exemplary treatment practices and strategies, in a variety of settings;
