<b>Training Description:</b>	The purpose of this full-day training is to provide participants with a detailed overview of medications that have been shown to be effective as a component of the treatment of alcohol and opioid use disorders. Topics will include: the context for medication-assisted treatment (positive and negative perceptions), the epidemiology of alcohol and opioid use and dependence (user demographics), a review of the various classes of opioids, an overview of each medication, its indication, to whom it is administered, and how it works, and treatment settings for medication-assisted treatment. Medications will include: acamprosate, disulfiram, naltrexone, methadone, and buprenorphine. The training will conclude with a session on talking to clients about their use of medications, and strategies to address health disparities through increased access to medication-assisted treatment. Time will be provided throughout the training for discussion and questions.
<b>Educational Objectives:</b>	At the conclusion of the daylong MAT training, participants will be able to: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Describe at least three (3) acute and chronic effects of alcohol, heroin, and other opioids.</li> <li>2. Describe the prevalence of and key populations impacted by alcohol and opioid use, abuse, and dependence.</li> <li>3. Provide examples of three (3) medications that are available to treat alcohol and opioid use disorders.</li> <li>4. List and explain at least two strategies that can be used to address health disparities through increased access to medication-assisted treatment.</li> <li>5. List at least two (2) common perceptions of medication-assisted treatment.</li> </ol>
