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<p><b>Training Description and Core Clinical Components:</b></p>	<p>This two-hour live virtual training for California providers will focus on an overview of Indigenous psychology and will feature cultural-clinical approaches congruent with a Native way of knowing. Attendees will learn what kind of attitude and mindset are essential to effective counseling in this population. Case stories will be presented to illustrate the concepts. All providers who are interested in increasing their skills to provide culturally responsive behavioral health and substance use disorder treatment to Tribal/Urban Indian people are encouraged to attend.</p>

Identify two tenets of Indigenous psychology.</li> <li>2. Distinguish two ways that clinical training is disconnected with Native way of knowing.</li> <li>3. Recall two attitudes that are effective in connecting with clients.</li> <li>4. Explain one conceptual framework that is effective in bringing about optimal healing conditions for therapy.</li> </ol>
