Shoshanna Johnson (Absentee Shawnee, Sac and Fox)

Shoshanna is from the Absentee Shawnee Tribe of Oklahoma and the Sac and Fox Nation. She graduated from the University of Central Oklahoma with a Bachelors in Strategic-Organizational Communications with an emphasis in Journalism. Her prevention work in Indian Country spans over the past 6 years working with Tribes and Tribal organizations in rural and urban communities at the local, State and National level. She is currently a Public Relations Specialist for the Absentee Shawnee Tribal Health System, located in Shawnee and Norman, Oklahoma.



Hozshona Morningstar Post (Kiowa)

My name is Hozshona Morningstar Post. My Kiowa name is Sayhn-Peehn-Daw-Gyah-Maw ("Peyote Song Woman"). I am a proud member of the Kiowa Tribe of Oklahoma. I am a current freshman at Rice University double majoring in Cognitive Sciences and Computer Science. I am also a teacher candidate for the Kiowa Tribe Language and Culture Revitalization Program and I'm hoping to become credentialed to teach our language to younger generations. I was raised in a big household that has strong ties to the Kiowa community, our language, songs, dances, and Kiowa ways. I strive to help my Native community as much as I can in order for future generations to prosper.



Keely Driscoll (Meskwaki)

Ttakimaweakwe ("Little Wolf Woman") is Meskwaki with ties to the Winnebago Tribe of Nebraska from Tama, Iowa. She is going into her senior year at the University of Iowa, majoring in International Studies with certificates in Sustainability and Native American and Indigenous Studies. In 2018, she was awarded the 7th Generation Youth Advocate Award during her reign as Jr. Miss Sac and Fox Nation Princess of Oklahoma for using her platform to advocate for substance misuse and underage drinking prevention. Stevi has also received recognition for becoming the youngest trainer through the Community Anti-Drug Coalitions of America's National Youth Leadership Initiative at 11 years old.
