

A SUICIDE RISK ASSESSMENT TOOL

S EX -Males kill themselves four times more often than females
 A GE – Certain age groups are more at risk
 D EPRESSION – Depressed persons significantly more at risk

P REVIOUS ATTEMPT – More likely to attempt in future
E THANOL – Alcohol abuse very often implicated in suicide
R ATIONAL THOUGHT – More prone to suicide if psychotic
S OCIAL NETWORK – Less social support, greater the risk
O RGANIZED PLAN – Greater risk if plans are organized
N O SPOUSE – Greater risk of suicide if there is no spouse
S ICKNESS – A chronic physical sickness makes one more prone



Suicide Prevention Apps


 Suicide Safe is the SAFE-T card and many other resources on your phone.
