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In 2020, 1 in 66 adults in the U.S. was under community supervision¹ and 60 to 80% of individuals on probation have a substance use disorder².


OBJECTIVES:








Working Relationship between Pos* and CTPs*

WHAT DO WE KNOW?

- Training for integration of OUD treatment during community supervision is needed to save lives
- Community supervision professionals have limited time and there are barriers to in person training
- Understanding roles and expectations, including program participants, is critical
- MOUD training reduces barriers to supporting recovery and rehabilitation for people under supervision
