What's the value of advanced training in Clinical Psychopharmacology?

- Better patient care, multidimensional conceptualization
- Improved/accurate diagnostics and treatment
- Medication knowledge and interpretation of medical reports
- Improved consultation with allied health professionals
- Improved access to and continuity of care
- All applicable to the field of Addictions and Dual Dx!

Common MSCP degree Requirements

- Didactic Coursework (may include hands-on clinical skill training; e.g. neuroanatomy, physical assessment/vitals, national exam prep)
- Supervised Clinical Fieldwork (aka Practica, Internship, Fellowship)
 - Physical Assessment
 - Combined Medicine (Psychological Intervention & Supervised Pharmacotherapy
- Final Capstone Examination

- NM (first to pass laws; Hawaii and Oregon tried first)
- LA
- 11
- ID
- IA
- CO
- UT (no MSCP degree Program in this state yet)
- *States proposing or prepping bill (next few slides over)
- ARNPs couldn't even prescribe until 1983

Alliant International University

- George M. Kapalka, PhD, MS, ABPP Distinguished Professor, Program Director
- First MSCP in the US, established 1998, APA designated
- About 700 graduates
- Students may meet RxP licensure in all RxP states
 - Only 80 hr physical assessment practicum required for graduation
 - Other practica may be arranged post-degree to meet RxP requirements
- 2 years, 5 courses per year, 1 class at a time in 8 week terms
- Live classes via Zoom once per week on weekends
- Faculty includes prescribing psychologists, psychologists, psychiatrist, nurse practitioner, prescribing pharmacists

University of Colorado Denver

Director: Amy Wachholtz, PhD, MDiv, MSCP Amy.Wachholtz@UCDenver.Edu

- MSCP-only (non-lisc track; 2 year)
- MSCP+ Prescribing Fellowship Certificate (lisc track; 3 years)
- Meets CO HB23-1701 + APA Program standards
- Coursework
 - 8 week blocks taught sequentially in a semester (2 per semester)
 - 1 night/week online live class
 - Exception: Physical Assessment Course in person- 1 week intensive course
 - Fellowship: 750 hours (150 unique patients)

- APA Designation Criteria in the Training and Education of Clinical Psychopharmacology (Model Curriculum)
- Academic Degree Requirements (<u>NMSU Example</u>)
- State laws of Prescriptive Authority (now 7 states)
- ASPPB Psychopharmacology Examination of Psychologists

Public Safety and Trust

- Laws written with the influence of the medical community
- Consultation and Medical Literacy
- State Board Prescriptive Authority license → Board of Pharmacy Controlled Substance # → DEA # → Prescription Monitoring Program (e.g. NM PMP)
- Substantial Continuing Education (most Programs have APA Sponsored CE; 60 CE for renewal, 40 must be Psychopharm in NM)
- Professional Organizations
 - <u>State Psychological Association of NM</u>
 - APA Div. 55: Society of Prescribing Psychologists

Opposition and Ethics

- Prescriptive Authority for Psychologists: The Next Step (journal article)
- APA Practice Guidelines Regarding Psychologists' Involvement in Pharmacological Issues
- Influence of individual graduate training programs
 - Comp Exam example (efficacy of psychotherapy vs. psychotropics)
- The influence of the AMA, state BOMs, and NAMI.

The Power to Unprescribe?!

- The power/ability to prescribe includes also the power/ability to "unprescribe."
- Titration/Discontinuation
- Recognition of Side Effects presenting as psych symptoms (including intoxication and withdrawal)
 - Brief patient benzo story as an early career psychologist
- Recognition of serious Adverse Drug Reactions
- Recognition of disease pathology mimicking psych symptoms
